Artist Facts:

- Harold Gilman was a British painter born in Somerset. His work often included interiors, landscapes and portraits.
- Harold was part of a group of English Post-impressionist artists that took inspiration from artists such as Vincent van Gogh.
- His work often included bold colours and strong brush marks.







- This painting, a rare portrait of a gardener shows a man of African descent.
- The image is very important as previously black people in British art were not painted in everyday clothing. Instead they had been shown in 'exotic dress', appearing in historical or genre scenes.
- The painting is exhibited at the Garden Museum because of its celebration of gardening and gardeners
